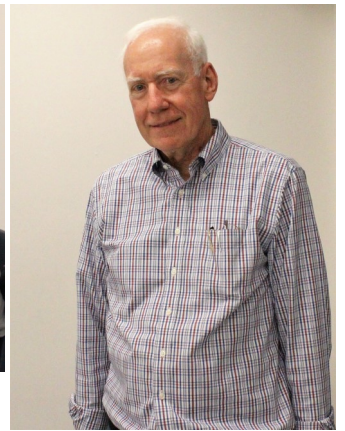
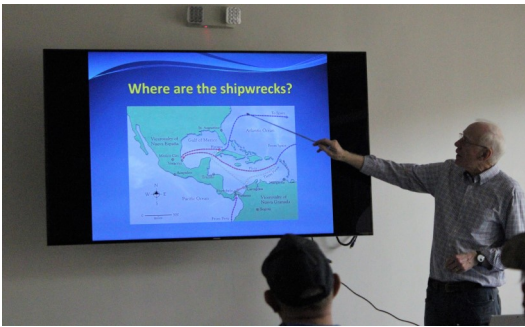
Best Finds Competition

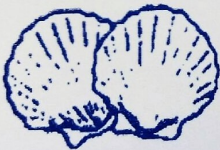
