Your detector isn't just for finding pull-tabs.

I have been detecting for about five years, now. I have found a few nice things, but my finds box is mostly full of junk – bottle caps, pull-tabs, toys, fake jewelry, and other 'treasure'.

A few weeks ago, I got a call from my sister. She was trying to locate a pipe that ran underground from a parking lot to the side of her house. Melody and I located it, and we were able to trace the pipe's path completely from the house to the parking lot. My sister could have dug a bunch of holes and located the pipe, but we were able to find it easily with my Equinox 800.

Over the Fourth of July weekend, we were talking with a new friend we had made while visiting our daughter and son-in-law. He said he was trying to find the corner of a nearby lot, but he couldn't find the survey marker. I told him that if he had a general idea where the marker should be, we could find it. The next day, we went looking for the marker. After finding some antique Budweiser cans and a complete beaver-tail pull tab, we found an aluminum tube with plastic end caps just below the surface. This may be the marker! He said he knows a surveyor who is familiar with the area, so he should be able to confirm if this is the real marker.

There are many uses for your detector; just keep your eyes open for the opportunities.
