# **TIPS**

#### **PARADIGMS**

(A set of ideas or rules, a way of looking or thinking about something.)

Thinking "inside the box" can be very limiting. We tend to apply rules to things we really don't know about. This can lead to limiting your finds.

You're thinking "There's nothing to be found at that site" or "This signal is a deep nail."

It's OK to use our experience and knowledge to make decisions, a long as we don't limit ourselves with narrow thinking.

- 1. Thinking you're in a slump. You try everything, hitting new sites, switching machines, coils, techniques and settings, etc. You might think you're doing the right thing, to no avail.
  - The problem is that when you walk out onto a site to detect, trying to break out of the slump, or thinking about it, somehow your mind backs that thinking. This is one thing about detecting that's very aggravating.
  - Try taking some time off to reset your thinking
- 2. The deep nail signal. We discount this signal as a nail and don't dig it. It can be a 12" deep seated coin or other treasure or the perfect 5" silver quarter signal. We're wondering what year it is, before we dig and it turns out to be a ridiculous piece of trash.

It's true that you can't go around digging every deep signal, but when you're hunting a hunted site or other sites with sparse targets, those "deep nail" signals can be your friend.


