




2024 DUES


The eyeglasses go to organizations that provide glasses for those who are in need.

TIPS

HALO EFFECT/GHOST SIGNAL

Disappearance of a good signal occurs during target recovery. It is caused either by human error or flaws in the detector's electronic design... or just bad luck. The detector "sees" a small iron target as a large object and produces a FALSE signal, either a high-pitched tone (if multi tone audio is implemented) or just a coin-like signal as if the object is non-ferrous and of high conductivity (made of copper or silver) The Halo Effect is ALWAYS associated with either long term burial of an object or highly acidic soil. The Halo Effect immediately disappears upon digging up the iron target due to shifting and displacing of the soil surrounding the target, causing the Halo to break instantly. To determine if the Halo effect is involved in the good signal disappearance, set up the Discrimination level at least on "rejecting all nails" and utilize the Audio Threshold in your search program (make sure you don't utilize the SILENT SEARCH mode). You will hear constant and barely audible humming of the THRESHOLD during the search.


